**Kathryn J. Boor Receives  
DeLaval Dairy Extension Award**

**Savoy, IL** — The American Dairy Science Association is proud to announce Kathryn J. Boor of Cornell University as the 2006 recipient of the DeLaval Dairy Extension Award. The award was presented on Tuesday, July 11, 2006 during the awards ceremony at the ADSA Annual Meeting in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

The DeLaval Dairy Extension Award was created to recognize outstanding achievements in dairy extension. The winner must have made a valuable and noteworthy contribution to the dairy industry through dairy extension in the broad areas of production, manufacturing, marketing, and youth work, be active in dairy extension when nominated and with at least ten years of dairy extension work with an educational or public institution, and have been a member of the American Dairy Science Association for at least five successive years.

Kathryn Boor is a professor in the Department of Food Science at Cornell University. Boor earned BS and MS degrees in food science and a PhD in microbiology from the University of California, Davis. The core of her extension program at Cornell is the Milk Quality Improvement Program (MQIP), funded by the New York State Milk Promotion Advisory Board. MQIP is an integrated extension program designed to enhance fluid milk quality through monitoring, testing, and education. Boor's extension program has contributed to numerous measurable improvements in New York fluid milk quality as well as quality of other manufactured dairy products.
