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**David J. Schingoethe Receives
ADSA Award of Honor**

Savoy, IL — The American Dairy Science Association is proud to announce David J. Schingoethe of South Dakota State University as the 2006 recipient of the ADSA Award of Honor. The award was presented on Tuesday, July 11, 2006 during the awards ceremony at the ADSA Annual Meeting in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

The ADSA Award of Honor was created to recognize unusually outstanding and consistent contributions to the welfare of the Association or distinguished service to the Association. The award is primarily for services to the American Dairy Science Association, with career achievements or contributions to other segments of the dairy industry receiving secondary consideration.
