**Daniel Sauvant Receives
International Dairy Production Award**

Savoy, IL — The American Dairy Science Association is proud to announce Daniel Sauvant of Institut National Agronomique Paris-Grignon as the 2007 recipient of the International Dairy Production Award. The award was presented on Tuesday, July 10, 2007, during the awards ceremony at the ADSA Annual Meeting in San Antonio, Texas.

The International Dairy Production Award was created to recognize and stimulate distinguished service to dairy production outside the United States and Canada. The winner must have made a meritorious scientific contribution by way of teaching, research, or other service to dairy production in one or more of the developing and/or developed areas of the world over a period of five or more years. Particular attention is paid to the long-term effects of the contribution.

Throughout his career, Daniel Sauvant, professor at the Institut National Agronomique Paris-Grignon, has modeled nutritional processes in lactating cows and goats. He has taught throughout the French-speaking world and his leadership has resulted in a series of key INRA publications. For example, "Tables of Composition and Nutritive Value of Feed for Livestock" is available in French, English, Spanish, and Chinese, and "Methods for Prediction of Nutritive Value of Concentrates and By-products" is now in its fourth edition. He is a prolific scientist, internationally renowned teacher, and interdisciplinary team player. Presenting Daniel Sauvant with the 2007 International Dairy Production Award is a fitting recognition of his distinguished service to dairy production outside North America.
