He is also the co-director of Vermont Institute for Artisan Cheese. He has also served as the associate director of Northeast Dairy Foods Research Center and the coordinator for the Vermont Agricultural Station's Competitive Hatch Program. Paul Kindstedt received his PhD in food science from Cornell University, and his MS in animal science and BS in dairy technology from the University of Vermont. He is the 1993 recipient of the prestigious ADSA Pfizer Award in Cheese and Cultured Products.
