Dr. Limin Kung Receives American Feed Industry Association Award

Champaign, IL – The American Dairy Science Association is proud to announce Dr. Limin Kung as the 2009 recipient of the American Feed Industry Association Award. The award was presented on Tuesday, July 14, 2009, during the awards ceremony at the ADSA Annual Meeting in Montreal, QC, Canada.

The American Feed Industry Association Award was created to promote research in dairy cattle nutrition. The award recognizes an individual who has made a worthy contribution to research of dairy cattle nutrition within the ten years immediately prior to the year of the award. The winner must have had original research work published, conducted research at a public institution, hospital, or similar institution, and been a member of the American Dairy Science Association for at least five successive years.

Limin Kung, Jr., is recognized nationally and internationally for his outstanding research contributions to the dairy industry in the areas of rumen and silage fermentation. He has constantly striven to conduct timely and applicable research to improve the efficiency of production and increase net farm income on dairy farms. Kung received his bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Hawaii and his PhD from Michigan State University. Kung is currently a professor at the University of Delaware, where he has a research, teaching, and extension appointment.
