He has made a major contribution in the areas of milk enzymology and the application of emerging processing technologies to dairy foods. Kelly has published over 150 research papers, reviews, and book chapters. He is an associate editor of the *International Dairy Journal* and is on the editorial boards of several other dairy and food journals. Kelly is currently dean of graduate studies at University College Cork.
