Dr. Ric Grummer Receives ADSA Fellow Award

Champaign, IL – The American Dairy Science Association is pleased to announce Dr. Ric Grummer as a 2010 recipient of the ADSA Fellow Award. The award was presented on Tuesday, July 13, 2010, during the awards ceremony at the ADSA Annual Meeting in Denver, Colorado.

The purpose of the ADSA Fellow Award is to recognize Dairy Foods Division and Production Division members of the American Dairy Science Association who have rendered distinguished service to the dairy industry over 20 years or more. The winner must have made exceptional contributions to the dairy industry, to a dairy related discipline, or the American Dairy Science Association; in addition, the winner must be and have been a member of the American Dairy Science Association for a minimum of twenty years.

Grummer is professor and past chair in the Department of Dairy Science at the University of Wisconsin–Madison. He is internationally recognized for research on management of transition dairy cows and nutritional prevention of metabolic disorders. Grummer coauthored the 7th revised edition of *Nutrient Requirements of Dairy Cattle*. He has published more than 100 peer-reviewed research articles and 9 book chapters and has made more than 300 invited presentations in 18 countries. He was the recipient of the ADSA 1995 American Feed Industry Award and the 2004 Nutrition Professionals Inc. Applied Nutrition Award. Grummer serves on the ADSA board of directors.
