Dr. Richard Grant Receives Pioneer Hi-Bred Forage Award

Champaign, IL – The American Dairy Science Association is pleased to announce Dr. Richard Grant as the 2010 recipient of the Pioneer Hi-Bred Forage Award. The award was presented on Tuesday, July 13, 2010, during the awards ceremony at the ADSA Annual Meeting in Denver, Colorado.

The Pioneer Hi-Bred Forage Award recognizes outstanding research (basic or applied) and/or educational contributions in the area of forage production, processing, storage, or utilization. The recipient must have made significant contributions in forage production, processing, storage, and utilization in one or more areas such as basic and applied forage research and/or education, including technology transfer and extension, and application of forage information to producers and public.

Grant is president of the William H. Miner Agricultural Research Institute in Chazy, New York. He received his BS in animal science from Cornell University and PhD from Purdue University. From 1990 to 2002, Grant was a faculty member in the Department of Animal Science at the University of Nebraska–Lincoln. He has served as president of Miner Institute since 2003, and leads a talented team of researchers focused on improving methods to measure the physical and chemical components of forage quality.
