Also, don't forget about your regional meetings! They are a great way to get involved, so encourage all your dairy club friends to attend. There's always a good time to be had by all.

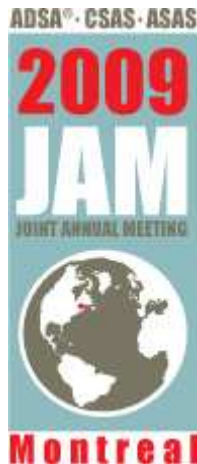

A Look Back at this Year's Meeting....



Dairy science students from 18 universities across the US and Canada attended the joint meetings of the American Dairy Science Association and American Society of Animal Science in Montreal. The student meetings were held July 11-14, and attracted approximately 100 student and advisors in addition to the nearly 3000 professionals from the US, Mexico, Canada, and beyond.

Saturday: We covered a lot of miles our first day in Montreal, going places on bus, on boat and on foot. We kicked off our activities Saturday morning by boarding buses and heading out of town for tours of two dairy farms. This was a great opportunity to get a first hand look at dairying in Canada. Both farms were wonderful hosts and everyone who participated enjoyed the tours.

As the rain conveniently settled in over Montreal, we boarded the river cruiser Bateau-Mouche for a scenic cruise along the beautiful St. Lawrence River. This was not only a great way to learn about the history of this great city, but we also had plenty of time to visit with old friends and meet new friends.

Later that evening, we all met up for dinner and refreshments at the student informal mixer held at Pub St. Paul in the heart of Old Montreal, a great waterfront area filled with shops, restaurants and nightclubs. With no real break in the rain, some chose to stay on for the breathtaking fireworks display during the Montreal International Fireworks Competition held over the river. Others retreated to the dry and warmth of the Holiday Inn, our headquarter hotel.

Sunday: On Sunday students met at noon for the first official event of the meeting, the Midday Pizza Party and Mixer. Aside from some really good pizza, the mixer was a great way for students to get acquainted with students from other clubs and to get to know the officer candidates. The lunch was followed by this year's Dairy Quiz Bowl. The double elimination competition was exciting right down to the last minute! Sunday night, students joined the parent organization for the Opening Session and Reception, a great chance for students to mingle and even do a little networking.

Monday: It was all business Monday with a full day of business meetings, competitions and the activities symposium. That evening, everyone had a chance to unwind just a little by gathering in groups and hitting the town. So much to do in Montreal, just not enough time to see it all!

Tuesday: The students reconvened on Tuesday for officer elections and a career symposium where students met with professionals in a round table format. Students had the opportunity to meet professionals in a small group, hear about their job and career and internship opportunities in their field and in some cases, within their organization. Then students had the opportunity to ask questions. The meeting ended on a high note with the student luncheon, which included a very lively dairy quiz bowl where the student officers took on the ADSA Board. It was a close and often times, hilarious match up, but in the end and for the fourth straight year, the adults proved no match for the whiz kids from SAD. (Do you think they just *let* them win??!)
