Most come to see the old mission where a small band of Texans held out for thirteen days against the Centralist army of General Antonio López de Santa Anna. Located on Alamo Plaza in downtown San Antonio, Texas, the Alamo represents nearly 300 years of history. Three buildings - the Shrine, Long Barrack Museum and Gift Museum - house exhibits on the Texas Revolution and Texas History. Visitors are welcome to stroll through the beautiful Alamo Gardens. Just a short distance from the River Walk and the Hyatt (the Student Hotel), the Alamo is a "must see" for all who come to San Antonio.

“Super Bull” Weekend a Victory for Midwest Dairy Students

Super Bowl weekend was filled with more than just football for the nearly 400 hundred students who attended the Midwest ADSA-SAD annual meeting. Surrounded by the “Super Bull” theme, students had a chance to participate in a two days packed with workshops, competitions, farm tours and networking related, not to football, but the dairy industry!

The event, held Feb. 2-3 at Kansas State University in Manhattan, Kan., attracted students from 13 universities including: Kansas State University, Ohio State University, Iowa State University, Michigan State University, UW-Platteville, UW-Madison, UW-River Falls, University of Minnesota-Twin Cities, University of Minnesota-Crookston, University of Illinois, Purdue University, South Dakota State University and North Dakota State University.

The conference kickoff included opening remarks from the Midwest ADSA-SAD officer team, as well as ADSA president Gary Hartnell. Attendees were then fired up by a motivational speaker who had a unique use for the pink flamingo and then regaled by a true cowboy poet.

The ever-popular karaoke contest wrapped up the first day of the conference and included many lively acts as usual. Taking home top honors was Iowa State University with their hilarious Fergie parody entitled “Milkalicious.”

The second day of the conference included junior and senior dairy bowls competitions. After the last buzzer sounded, the University of Illinois emerged victorious in the senior division while the University of Wisconsin – River Falls topped the junior rounds. After the morning’s competition, students had a chance to connect with current issues in the dairy industry by attending workshops on the K-State campus. Topics ranged from mico-dairy processing to pest control on farms and featured speakers from around the state.

The highlight of the conference was the annual awards banquet. Several awards were given out, and the University of Minnesota seemed to clean house, sweeping the awards for best yearbook, outstanding chapter display and “Biggest Unit” for having the most participants in attendance. Purdue received the outstanding scrapbook award, while the University of Illinois took home top honors for the best chapter Web site and Michigan State won the “Farthest Traveled” award. It was also announced that next year’s conference will be hosted by the University of Minnesota.

Overall the conference will go down in the scorebooks as a victory. Students had a great time while broadening their knowledge of the dairy industry and making new contacts with other dairy students, faculty and industry members. Many thanks go to the K-State dairy club for their outstanding hospitality and excellent organization in hosting this event.
