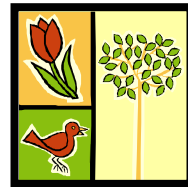
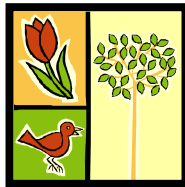
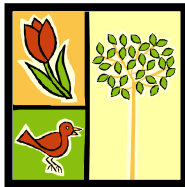

### Important Dates and Deadlines Checklist

#### May 15 (note later deadline!)

The **2008 Midwest ADSA-SAD Conference** was a royal flush! Brimming with a casino theme dairy science club students from across the Midwest were drawn to Minneapolis, Minnesota, on February 22-23<sup>rd</sup> for a weekend filled with competition, speakers, and networking opportunities. Attending this year's event included North Dakota State University, South Dakota State University, Kansas State University, Ohio State University, Purdue, University of Illinois, Michigan State University, University of Minnesota-Crookston, Iowa State University, University of Wisconsin-Platteville, University of Wisconsin-Madison, University of Wisconsin-River Falls, and University of Minnesota-Twin Cities.

The events started Friday evening with several intense rounds of dairy quiz bowl preliminaries and the opening session. Welcoming everyone was this year's host school University of Minnesota-Twin Cities and the 2007-2008 Midwest officer team. MaryAnne Drake, national ADSA president, welcomed everyone to this year's conference. University of Minnesota alumni Kyle Sonnek from Cargill Animal Nutrition served as the key note speaker. This year's candidates for regional officer were also introduced. After the meeting was adjourned club members rushed back to their hotel rooms for some last minute preparation and practice for the karaoke contest. Wearing cow costume, overalls, and matching shirts schools took to the stage to strut their stuff. After some great performances Iowa State University was named the winner.

Saturday morning students gathered to watch the quiz bowl finals.
