A Look Back at this Year's Meeting....

An event-full meeting – that's how you can best describe the 2005 SAD Meeting in Cincinnati! Held July 23-26, more than 130 students and advisors in addition to the nearly 3000 professionals from the US, Mexico, Canada, and elsewhere were in attendance. The meeting began with a warm but relaxing riverboat ride up and down the Ohio River, complete with scenic views of Kentucky, Ohio and the Cincinnati skyline. That evening, all gathered to watch the Cincinnati Reds take on the Milwaukee Brewers. A very well-attended pizza party brought the group together on Sunday. The lunch was followed by a record 12 teams participating in this year's Dairy Quiz Bowl. Sunday night, everyone crossed the river to nearby Newport, Kentucky for an evening of fun and games at Gameworks. On Monday, the students got down to business with an opening business meeting, various competitions, club activities symposium, and much more. The evening was capped off with a dance party. A bit groggy from the night before but no less enthused, the students reconvened on Tuesday for officer elections and a unique career symposium where students were able to interact face to face with leaders in the dairy industry on topics such as opportunities, career planning, and much more. The meeting ended on a high note with the student luncheon, which included a very lively dairy quiz bowl where the student officers took on the ADSA Board. It was a close match up, but in the end, the adults proved no match for the whiz kids from SAD.

Actions taken at this summer's SAD Business Meetings:

- To improve efficiency, beginning in 2006 there will be one deadline for all competition entries. May 1 will be the entry deadline for all activities including membership, competition entries including dairy quiz bowl, and for annual report title pages. However, the deadline for abstract submission will be February 1.
- Although this first year the Electronic Yearbook competition had no entries, it was agreed to continue with the competition for 2006. Cal Poly agreed to provide an example electronic yearbook for clubs to view. **To view the example, go to the SAD web site at www.adsa.org/sad.asp.**
- To join the parent organization in their celebration of ADSA's Centennial, the SAD voted that chapter displays should have a historical theme in 2006. Instead of the traditional chapter display, clubs are encouraged to prepare a poster that tells the history of their dairy club. The chapter display scoring will be altered to accommodate the historical aspect. Clubs will also be asked to submit these posters electronically to ADSA for posting to ADSA's website and for archival purposes. More details to come later.
- Beginning in Fall 05, membership in SAD will be renewed as part of the parent organization renewal process, meaning clubs will receive renewal notices for their students' memberships in the fall so students can enjoy the full benefits of membership throughout the school year. Note that memberships must be paid by May 1 to receive full points on the Chapter Award Scorecard. Clubs will continue to receive renewal notices into the new year to accommodate those that universities on semesters.
- The parent organization is working to launch a database where students can post their resumes and companies can post job and internship announcements. Once launched, student members of ADSA will receive regular notification of access and updates via email. Students suggested the parent organization provide a standardized form for them to complete and submit. Also the form should have an expiration date so materials are current.
- Plans are underway for the students to have an opportunity to meet with company representatives during the 2006 meeting. It was proposed that a time be set aside for the students to have exclusive access to exhibitors and to universities with grad school opportunities. Students will be asked to come with copies of their resumes and companies will be asked to have information on job and internship opportunities available.

Jon Schefers, Officer At Large

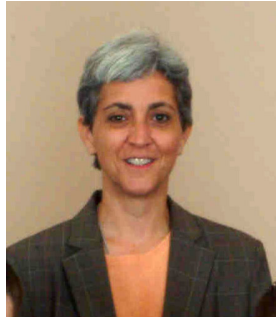
